Excuse due to Public Interest /Public Welfare

I wish to be excused from jury duty in the best interests of the state as I firmly believe the judicial system is corrupt and does not serve justice.

I have been subjected to two incidents by the Commission on Judicial Conduct that refused to act to stop a gross miscarriage of justice that affected the public in general.

1. In *Phoenix Townhouse v. Off. Admin. Hearings*, LC2008-000740-001 DT, a challenge to the constitutionality of a statute that was decided by a default decision, I was prevented from participating as an Intevenor. My motion was denied without a reason, the first miscarriage of justice. When I attempted to inform the judge of important evidence, a lack of any real person in interest supported by county records, I was told, “Stifle yourself.” See attached March 2, 2008 Minute Entry by Judge McMurdie and decision by the Commission on Judicial Conduct. An insult to the courts and no concern for upholding the integrity of the courts.
2. In *DC Lot Owners v. Maxwell*, CV 2010-004684, Pinal County Judge Olson sealed ALL the records in this case thereby preventing the public from having any knowledge of the legal action by a court appointed receiver looking for some \$650,000 in missing HOA funds. Maxwell was the HOA attorney being charged with aiding and abetting and disgorgement among other things. See attached complaint page.

His action was a prima facie violation of the Supreme Court Rules on Judicial Conduct, Rule 124(d), yet the Commission on Judicial Conduct said, not my job. This is also a violation of the Supreme Court rules on judicial conduct – if you have knowledge of wrongdoing you must take action.

The Commission’s first response was to attack the messenger in what appears to be, who told him? See its July 6 letter. And again, a “not my job” response from the Commission.

Who then protects the people from the judges? The system is corrupt and I cannot participate with integrity in a system that makes a mockery of justice. I asked to be excused in the best interests of the people.
